





UTV & Snowmobile Parking

Winter vehicle parking is at a premium especially during the holidays. Please remember to park your UTV's and snowmobiles on the west hill if you will be gone for more than two days. Arrowhead Outreach team members will be on duty during the holidays to ensure rules are followed, allowing parking access to all owners.

Diesel Parking

We currently have four more diesel parking spots open if anyone needs one for this winter season. Contact Arrowhead Outreach for assistance.

Trailer Parking

Thank you to everyone for calling us before parking your trailers. It has greatly helped us properly align the parking. Once the flatbed trailer area gets full, we will be parking additional flatbeds in the north

Arrowhead Improvements Association (AIA) Opens October 15th and closes on May 31th. (CLOSED during the Summer months) All vehicles must be registered with Arrowhead Outreach and display a yellow Arrowhead sticker or guest pass. This includes cars, trucks, trailers, snowmobiles, and UTVs. Parking is limited to the areas indicated in GREEN. Property owners are permitted on-highway vehicles in the main parking area.

Winter Parking Lot

- Individual cars and trucks are to park in the main area, aligning with the orange cones. Do not extend the south end of the vehicle past the line designated
- Snowmobiles are to park above the berm on the west side of the parking lot.
- Tracked UTVs (Geezer-mobiles) are to park between the signs, located on the NW corner hillside.
- Box trailers are to be parked on the West hillside. See helow Required Fee Schedule or contact Arrowhead Outreach.
- Flatbed trailers are parked in the NW corner of the main parking area. See below Required Fee Schedule or contact Arrowhead Outreach.

Other Dos and Don'ts

- Do not leave your snowmobiles or UTV vehicles in the regular parking areas if you will be off the mountain for more than 2 days (48 hours).
- You must remove your vehicle when maintenance is plowing the lot. If you cannot remove your vehicle, you must make arrangements with a neighbor or Arrowhead Outreach for help.
- Never chain snowmobiles together

end of overflow parking after Will plows it. We will continue to park on the west bank and later move some as needed to the overflow. Again, please contact us before parking your trailer, and we will meet you at parking lot.

Please contact us if the vehicle/trailer parking in front of diesel parking is full. We will assist you in finding a parking location.

Remember, the trailer/vehicle parking in front of the diesel parking is only temporary, not full-time parking.

Overflow Parking Area

The overflow parking area is for use when we are plowing the main parking lot. Please park in the main parking lot unless we've notified everyone to temporarily move to the overflow area for plowing. Please don't make the overflow your main parking. Remember that no trailers, solo or attached to a vehicle, are allowed to park in the overflow area. Once our crews are finished plowing, we ask that you promptly move your vehicles back to the main parking lot.

Trash Compactor

The trash compactor has the second latch removed since bears aren't a problem during the winter, but because of this, we're frequently finding the door open. Please be sure the latch is secured when you shut the door. Thank you to most everyone honoring our compactor rules. Rules are posted by the compactor and on the AIA website. Please contact Arrowhead Outreach if you're still unsure if a specific item can be placed in the compactor. We're always glad to help. We will continue to follow up with anyone not following the compactor rules, and the new security cameras should make this task easier.

However, to the dismay of many of us snowmobilers, the snow has been slow to arrive. Rest assured, though, Will and Denny are prepared and ready when the time comes. Chaining up those machines is no easy task! Please pass them with caution when you meet them on the Alpine, at any time of the day or night. I would also like to introduce Jennifer Bonner and Steve Henderson as back up equipment operators in the event of illness,

emergency, or just as extra hands should the need arise.

A big shout out of thanks to Todd Rodencal, our resident tech guy, for designing and installing our newly expanded security camera system that is now operational! Multiple views of the entire winter lot parking area are now monitored 24 hours a day, as well as watching our fuel and snow cat/groomer staging area. If you see Todd around, thank him for his expertise; it is greatly appreciated!



Another shout out goes to Curtis Marconnet for assembling and scheduling our grooming crew for this winter's filing road grooming operations. Please be aware you can meet the groomer any time after dark. Grooming is typically started late in the evening when there are fewer people out, to minimize needing to pass oncoming traffic and lifting of the groomer. The groomer takes up the full width of the filing roads. These gentlemen sacrifice their time and expertise on cold nights when the rest of us are tucked away in our warm cabins for a comfortable night's winter nap.

When the **FILING ROADS** are **CLOSED** for the winter season, the Arrowhead Improvements Association wants to remind all owners, residents, and their guest, to please stay on ALL GROOMED filing roads and marked snowmobile trails within the Association's subdivision. "Boondocking," "shortcutting" and/or "widening" of the filing roads are all considered off trail riding, which is a violation of the *AIA Regulations and a criminal trespass under state law. Off trail riding that results in property damage carries higher penalties.

*AIA Regulations - Article 7, section 2, subsections (E) & (F) and Colorado Revised Statutes - Criminal Code, section 18-4-504.



Forestry Message

Annual Forest Refuse Burn

The 2025 burn permit, PVT-25-305, was approved by the Colorado State Smoke Control, following their review. The primary ignition day is *tentatively* scheduled for Saturday, December 20th, based on weather conditions. The final pile size for 2025 presents a significant increase over previous years, due to the direct efforts of property owners and their contractors. Arrowhead Firewise Renewal

Arrowhead's Firewise renewal for 2026 was submitted on Friday, 11/21/2025, with updates to the Community-Wide Protection Plan and Community Risk Plan, including community mitigation efforts performed in 2025.

New Shortcut: Winter Parking Lot -> Balsam Road

The new shortcut from the winter parking lot to Balsam Road is ready for use... just in time for the snow season! The revised route is wider, allowing two winter track vehicles to pass safely using appropriate speeds. There are a few red reflectors that still need placed to identify the route so please use caution. Remember, short cuts are to be used ONLY when the filing roads are closed and there's sufficient snow for over-the-snow use. As you use this route during the winter season, please email me with any suggested safety improvements. Thank you to John Kurz, Cole Fresques, and others for their time and energy in developing the route!

A reminder from AIA Office Manager, Margaret Henry:

Dues assessments will increase again in 2026, because of the January 2024 favorable ballot vote to increase annual dues assessments.

2026 - beginning Jan. 1st: \$160/qtr. or \$640/yr. 2027 - beginning Jan. 1st: \$165/qtr. or \$660/yr.

- If you are signed up for "recurring payments" (autopay), the quarterly or monthly amount will automatically be adjusted to the new dues amount. You do not have to send in a new form.
- Please remember to change your "bank bill-pay" to the new amount.

Other billing reminders:

- Invoices are sent on the first of every quarter (Jan. 1, April 1, July 1, & Oct. 1).
 If sent by email, you can pay electronically from the email.
- You will not receive an invoice if you have a credit balance or have signed up for recurring payments.

AIA Requires an Email Address for EVERY Owner!

As the Board moves AIA into use of technology for communications, the new regulations require that AIA have an email address on file for the owner of each lot, or the person designated to act on behalf of any lot owned by an entity or several owners.

Design Review Message

The building season has ended in Arrowhead and we are anxiously awaiting our snow!! Our first meeting in 2026 will be March 9th. We will meet at the Arrowhead Mountain Lodge at 9am. If you are wanting to start a project next summer, you don't need to wait until we meet in the spring to start planning. You can get a jump on your plans by submitting everything to my email @jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com and I will have you on the agenda for the March 9th meeting. This way, we can help you get everything in place so the site visit can be conducted once the snow melts and you can begin your project. It also allows you time to get building permit applications turned in to Gunnison County if needed.

ONE new requirement from Gunnison County...If you're planning to replace or repair your roof (25% or more,) the county now requires you to get a building permit from them. Please contact the DRC with your plans and we can direct you to the correct contact with the county.

Gunnison County adopted new Wildfire Codes (WUI) in 2022. If you are planning to build in the future, it is recommended that you contact the county and let them educate you on the new codes. Each property is different and is treated as such, so there is NO easy answer to what building on your property will take. Just remember our building season is much shorter than normal areas and most contractors have already started booking their schedules for next year. With that being said, a couple of reminders:

- When you are planning a property improvement, you need to have the <u>Construction Agreement</u> and <u>Plot Plan</u> sent to me (ithompsonaia.drc@gmail.com), and the \$100 permit fee mailed to the highlighted address on the Construction Agreement:

- Send all building plans with the Plot Plan and Construction Agreement to jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com
- You need to locate your center pin and flag several points on the property boundary. Property owners are responsible for the accuracy of the center pin. A professional site survey is the best way to be positive of an accurate center pin, if it is in question or can't be found.
- Flag several points of the adjacent properties as needed
- Flag any site of improvements -- driveway, shed perimeter, trees you think need removed, etc.
- Once this is done contact Joanie Thompson
 (<u>jthompsonaia.drc@qmail.com</u>) and I or a committee member will
 schedule a time for a site visit
- Please refer to this <u>document</u> for many of the different project types done in Arrowhead
- Here is the link to the <u>Design Review Committee website</u> where you can find the <u>regulations</u> and more information

** <u>Utilities</u> ** - Many owners have been asking about putting in utilities. Please note that this **MUST** be approved by the Design Review Committee. You are not required to pay for a permit, but we must approve the location of your plans. Failure to notify the Design Review Committee could result in up to \$500 in fines.

Shed Regulations -

- All Sheds MUST be approved by the Arrowhead Design Review Committee. Click here for the process.
- If you have an approved Gunnison County septic system,
 AND your shed will be NO larger than 200sf, you do not need a
 Gunnison Co building permit. If the shed is larger than 200sf,
 you're required to apply for a building permit through Gunnison
 Co
- If you do not have an approved Gunnison County septic system, you're required to get a building permit from Gunnison County, no matter the size.

Please know that all property improvements need to go through the DRC. Most require a permit. Failure to notify the Design Review Committee could result in up to \$500 in fines. Some plans just get the go ahead "OK" because they are considered maintenance. It's better to ask than be in violation of the Arrowhead Regulations. We always have new contractors up here and they don't always know our Regulations. It is the property owner who is responsible for educating themselves and their contractors about the rules. If your contractor doesn't ask if you have gone through the Design Review Committee for approval, they are most likely not familiar with our rules and regulations.







Arrowhead (AIA) Filing Roads Speed Limit is 20mph ALL YEAR round!



During the Winter months, the filing roads in Arrowhead are CLOSED to all vehicular traffic except for snowmobiles and other tracked vehicles Emergency Address Signs: The reflective signs with your property address are on the

right side of the driveway to assist emergency access for the Arrowhead Fire

Protection District (AFPD) and should not be moved, removed or altered!!



Lakes & Fishing: There are three (3) lakes available to AIA property owners and their stocking of the Lower Flint Lakes and has set a catch limit of three (3) fish per person guests: Flint Lakes, Evergreen Lake and Hazel Lake. Fishing is available at Flint Lakes and at Evergreen Lake only. The AIA, through its' board of directors, regulates per day. Fishing Passes for Flint lakes is Required.
