



Grooming machines and maintenance personnel may be on the trails at anytime



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

ROADS CLOSED Snowmobile & Track Vehicles ONLY

Now that the **FILING ROADS** are **CLOSED** for the winter season, the Arrowhead Improvements Association wants to remind all owners, residents, and their guest, to please stay on ALL GROOMED filing roads and marked snowmobile trails within the Association's subdivision. "Boondocking," "shortcutting" and/or "widening" of the filing roads are all considered off trail riding, which is a violation of *AIA Regulations and a criminal trespass under state law. Off trail riding that results in property damage carries higher penalties.

*AIA Regulations - Article 7, section 2, subsections (E) & (F) and Colorado Revised Statutes - Criminal Code, section 18-4-504.





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Message from Patrol 🐼

The end of another year and a start of a New Year. Time sure gets away from us and it's hard to believe it is 2024. I hope everyone had an enjoyable Christmas and starting off the New Year on a good note.

This year the snow pack hasn't been as great as last year, but it is starting to accumulate. The roads were closed about a week after Thanksgiving. The groomer is working fine this year and the filing roads are being well maintained!

Patrol has finally started to place the snow stakes in the third week of January. Patrol plans on getting all the stakes up by the end of January. Some areas, we are finding the snow depth a little shallow and a challenge to keep the stakes up. Because of this, I am asking the public to help Patrol keep the stakes up. If you pass any stakes down, would you please try to reset them. Or, if you find a lot of stakes down, please give Patrol a call with a location of where the problem is and we will follow up. Until we get more snow depth, this problem may continue. Thank you in advance for your help!!





With the lack of snow this season, the parking lot was plowed and cleared the second week of January, with it snowing six inches while clearing the lot. (Mother nature's joke on us). Folks used the overflow parking while clearing the lot, but now it is two weeks later and we still have 23+ vehicles still parked in the same spot. We need owners to move their vehicles ASAP back to the main parking lot, so Will can keep the overflow plowed for the next clearing. Please help us use the overflow parking for what's intended to be used for.... and not as the MAIN parking lot! (The last thing we need is for Will to hit one of these cars while trying to keep this lot cleared.) Your cooperations is greatly appreciated.

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

2024 DRC Meeting Dates

All meetings start at 9am and are at the firehouse, unless the filing roads are not open, and then we will meet at Arrowhead Mountain Lodge.

The deadline to turn in applications is the Friday before the upcoming meeting. Anything received after midnight on Friday will be added to the following month's agenda.

The mountain is blanketed with a beautiful layer of snow and it is calm and quiet. If you are going to start a project this summer, you can do your planning early and have your documents ready for the March 11th meeting.

ALL documents (plot plan, construction agreement, and your detailed plans) are sent to: jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com. Only the \$100 permit fee goes to the AIA Office.

Sending documents to the AIA Office creates a middle man and will delay your plans getting approved.

After the snow melts, a site visit can be conducted and your application finalized.

Please remember the planned construction in the canyon is still projected to continue into, at least part of, 2024. This can lead to difficulties with deliveries and frustration with wait times. Be sure you talk with your contractors about how this will impact your project. If you plan to have something large delivered it is best to let the workers in the canyon know. If you are bringing up a shed, please call Patrol if the Alpine needs to be closed or monitored. Your friends and neighbors will appreciate your help with this.

Gunnison County has adopted new Wildfire Codes(WUI). If you are planning to build in the future, it is recommended that you contact the county and let them educate you with the new codes.

Each property is different and is treated as such, so there is NO easy answer to what building on your property will take. Just remember our building season is much shorter than normal areas and most of our contractors have already started working their schedule for next year. Click here for a link to a document to help you get started with your plans.

With that being said, a few reminders and links for your planning needs:

When you are planning a property improvement, you need to have the <u>Construction Agreement</u> and <u>Plot Plan</u> sent to me
 (<u>jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com</u>) and the <u>\$100 permit fee needs to be mailed to the highlighted address on the Construction Agreement.

DRC Permit: Arrowhead Street Address: Lot#- Blk#- Filing#

- Send all building plans with the Plot Plan and Construction Agreement to jthompsonaia.drc@gmail.com
- You need to locate your center pin(rebar and tag) and flag several points on the property boundary. **Property owners are responsible for the accuracy of the center pin.** A professional site survey is the best way to be positive of an accurate center pin, if it is in question or can't be found
- Flag several points of the adjacent properties as well
- Flag any site of improvements -- driveway, shed perimeter, trees you think need removed, etc
- Once this is done, contact Joanie Thompson (ithompsonaia.drc@gmail.com) and I or a committee member will come and do a site visit. It is requested that the property owner or contractor be present during the site visit.
- Please refer to this document for many of the different project types done in Arrowhead
- Here is the link to the <u>DRC website</u> where you can find the <u>regulations</u> and more information

Please remember that **all** property improvements need to go through the DRC. Most require a permit. Some just get the go ahead "OK" because they are considered maintenance. It is better to ask than be in violation of the <u>Arrowhead Regulations</u>. We have a lot of new contractors up here and they do not know our Regulations. It is the **homeowner** who is responsible for educating themselves and their contractors about the rules.

** Utilities ** - Many owners have been asking about putting in utilities. Please note that this MUST be approved by the Design Review Committee. You are not required to pay for a permit, but we must approve the location of your plans and issue a permit. Failure to notify the Design Review Committee could result in up to \$500 in fines.

**Shed Regulations ** -

- All Sheds MUST be approved by the Arrowhead Design Review Committee
- If you have an approved Gunnison Co septic system, you do not need a Gunnison Co building permit as long as your shed is no larger than 200sf. If the shed is larger than 200sf you are required to apply for a building permit through Gunnison Co.
- If you do not have an approved Gunnison Co septic system, you are required to get a building permit from Gunnison Co no matter what the size.

Please continue to follow the requirements set forth for improvements in the <u>2020 AIA Regulations</u>. This helps the committee move forward for you more quickly.

We look forward to serving the owners' of this great community.

Election Committee Update





Proposed AIA Assessment Increase

The proposal: to increase annual assessments in 2024 to \$600 per site with an annual increase of \$20 per site in years 2025, 2026 and 2027, with the costs for use of the Association's dumpsters included in the annual dues such that there will not be an additional charge by the Association for trash. Annual assessments will be assessed in equal quarterly installments beginning in the 2nd quarter 2024.

Election Process

- Preparation, mailing, receipt and tabulation of ballots was conducted by Law of the Rockies
- Ballots were mailed to all owners on November 17, 2023
- Deadline to return ballots was January 17, 2024
- 501 returned ballots were required for a 60% guorum of sites
- 50% affirmative votes of returned ballots were required for passage

Election Results

- 504 signed ballots were received by the return deadline
- 378 'yes' votes 75% of ballots received
- 126 'no' votes 25% of ballots received
- A verification of the count was conducted by a member of the AIA Election Committee and owner volunteers before the Regular Board Meeting on Saturday, January 20, 2024
- The increase was approved by a 252 vote margin and exceeded the required majority by 25%

The approved 2024 assessment increase of \$30 per quarter will be in effect the second quarter and included in the April 1, 2024 invoice. Quarterly assessments will be billed at \$150 each quarter. This is NOT a retroactive increase; no additional assessments are due for the first quarter of 2024. Arrowhead Office Manager Margaret Henry will be mailing or emailing owners further information which will likely answer your questions regarding prepaid 2024 assessments and/or trash fees, ACH payments and automatic billing.

The Board of Directors wishes to thank all owners who participated in this election, our Election Committee and the community volunteers who helped prepare ballots for mailing and verified the result.



MCH Pack Pricing:

The pricing for MCH packs this year is as follows:

Single Bubble MCH Packs: \$2.00 per pack
Double Bubble MCH packs: \$2.90 per pack

I would recommend that most folks order Double Bubble MCH packs again this year, these are much more cost effective as you can spread them out further and use less packs per lot. Please call or email me if you have any questions.

ACE Cap Pricing:

The pricing for ACE Caps is as follows:

50 ½" ACE Caps: \$45.00 per bag 75 3/8" ACE Caps: \$56.25 per bag

These were a hit last year with many folks ordering and having great success combating the Spruce Bud Worm problem we have been having. If you have any issues with the bud worm in years past, I would highly recommend installing ACE Caps in your trees to protect them. Please call or email me if you are unsure or have any questions.

With winter bringing heavy winds and extreme weather, please be on the lookout for fallen trees and take precautions when traveling on the filing roads in winds. I have heard of many issues with fallen trees this year, hopefully we don't have too many more this season.

Winter is a wonderful time in the forest with so many events going on. Hopefully we get a great snow season and have a great summer to come.



AIA Winter Parking Lot

- Opens October 15th and closes on May 31st. (CLOSED during the Summer months)
- All vehicles must be registered with Patrol and display a yellow Arrowhead sticker guest pass. This includes cars, trucks, trailers, snowmobiles, and UTVs.
- Parking is limited to the areas indicated in **GREEN**.
- Property owners are permitted on highway vehicles in the main parking area only.

Individual cars and trucks are to park in the main

- Tracked UTVs (Geezer#mobiles) are to park between the signs, located on the NW corner hillside.

- Flatbed trailers are parked in the NW corner of the main parking area. See below Required Fee Schedule or contact Patrol
- Weekend truck and trailer parking is in the NE corner of the parking lot. (No fee but a time limit is imposed.

No Parking Areas

- East side of the main area next to the large berm.
 - Behind the box trailers.

Other Dos and Don'ts

- Do not leave your snowmobiles or UTV vehicles in the regular parking areas if you will be off the mountain for more than 2 days (48 hrs).
- You must be here to remove your vehicle when maintenance is plowing the lot. If you cannot remove your vehicle, you must make arrangements with a neighbor or patrol for help.
- Never chain snowmobiles together.
