Patrol Agent:

The Patrol Agent safeguards the enforcement of the Association's covenants and regulations while providing safety measures on behalf of the Arrowhead Improvements Association community, its guests and visitors. The Patrol Agent is responsible for patrolling the Arrowhead Improvements Association subdivision by vehicle in the Summer & Fall months; including, but not limited to, by snowmobile in the Winter and early Spring months. The Patrol Agent must also have the ability to interact with members of the community during both non and emergency situations, gather critical information and documentation and reporting that information on to the Board of Directors. This part time position requires working only (1) one full 40-hour work week and off in a (3) three-week rotation of a given month.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Essential Functions:

- Patrol all Filing roads within the Arrowhead subdivision by vehicle in the Summer & Fall months; including but not limited to, by snowmobile in the Winter and early Spring months.
- Issue permits for fishing and campfire pits.
- Perform daily tour and check of the common areas.
- Coordinate with other agencies and/or private companies as needed for enforcement of Municipal Code issues (i.e. towing companies and humane societies).
- Maintain records and log books, files, memos and all necessary forms of correspondence related to daily activities, warnings, owner contacts and complete all required reports.
- Must operate radio, cell phone, computer and other equipment as needed to fulfill job requirements.
- With authorization from property owner, perform & patrol check on lots whether occupied or unoccupied.
- Ensure safety equipment is in proper condition within the patrol vehicle and snowmobiles.
- Perform periodic inspections of first-aid equipment located throughout the community.
- Participate in routine briefings and meetings.
- Practice & perform workplace safety and procedures.
- CPR & First Aid certification required upon employment. Training provided by the police and/or fire departments.
- Maintain log books of owner vehicles including recreational vehicles.
- Record and check registrations for 2"d RV use Check al check-in boxes
- Maintain and enforce parking regulations within the subdivision and the Winter Parking Lot; including vehicle and trailer check and issue parking warnings.
- Responds to emergency situations including but not limited to: security and phone activated alarms, fire alarms, evacuations, illnesses and injuries, in a timely manner.

- Must be knowledgeable with Microsoft Office (Word & Excel) and email programs.
- Must record and maintain daily patrol records.
- Effectively deal with unpredictable and difficult situations while acting in a calm manner.
- · Ability to perform the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodation; including, operating a chainsaw.
