The 2018 January Executive Session and Board meeting is officially behind us. Here are a few highlights to bring everyone up-to-date that could not be present.

1. The first item of business was to elect officers. The bottom line is that each officer was re-elected to continue to serve in their present positions for another year. They are:

Kim Norwood – President Dale Breckenridge – Treasurer

Dick Bloss - Vice-President **Bridget Isle** – Secretary

In addition, board liaisons for the community will remain the same. Whenever you have questions, issues, or suggestions pertaining to any of these areas, these are the persons to contact first. They are:

2. One of the biggest decisions we made was to delay the vote on the 2018 budget. After posting the proposed 2018 budget and sending it out to our owners we received some excellent feedback and recommendations for some substantive revisions. The board decided to call a Special Meeting in April (open for all owners to attend/date to be determined) to rework the 2018 budget.

Following that meeting we will again publish the revised budget for owner review and comment. Then, at our May Board meeting, we will vote on the 2018 budget proposal. In the meantime we will continue operating off the 2017 budget.

3. The 2018 Temporary Camping and RV Use Regulation was approved. If you have not read it already it is posted online. We voted in this January board meeting in order to give our RVers plenty of advance notice to make their plans for the 2018 camping season. In our 2018 August board meeting we will measure the impact and the effectiveness of the new regulation, hear from owners, and then make a decision whether to make it a permanent change or make revisions based on owner input and observations.

- 4. We are moving our Forest Refuse Site; aka: "No Stump Dump" to property that AIA already owns that is conveniently located just off the Alpine and completely out of site. This action was necessitated since the owner of our present forest refuse site decided not to renew our lease in order to put his ranch into a conservation easement. Work has already begun to dismantle the present site and we are working with Gunnison County for the appropriate permits and with our Fire Protection District to ensure that our new site is developed with appropriate safety and fire prevention measures. The benefit of this new site is that it will save us \$5,000 a year in lease costs and guarantees that we don't have to ever be concerned about losing our forest refuse site.
- **5**. We approved a revised Violation Report form for reporting violations of our rules and regulations. That form is also posted online. The revisions were necessary to make sure we had all the information we needed to go forward with an investigation of an alleged violation and to ensure that all of our owners are treated fairly.
- **6.** Finally, Jim Squirrell reported that the appraisal for the water company should be ready in a couple of weeks. As soon as that is complete our working groups will commence their work to determine the best way forward to provide for the water needs of our community. Again, if you have expertise in the areas of finance, legal, writing grants, infrastructure, water treatment, water rights, etc., we encourage you to volunteer to become involved in this process. We have so many talented owners in this community and want to utilize those talents to ensure we make the right decisions for the future of Arrowhead. Please drop me a note and let me know of your interest in serving.

There are numerous activities and events coming up in the future. Please make it a point to read each issue of the **Smoke Signals** and visit our **AIA website** to stay informed and to stay involved.

Heavy Equipment & Maintainence Report by Jim Matteson



Snow Dance???

Well, we finally started getting a bit of snow in January but we are way behind as of this writing. Everything is ready to go for winter if we could just get it to snow more.

Everything is ready to go from a heavy equipment perspective so we shouldn't have a problem dealing with the snow when it finally comes. If you haven't done it yet, it's time to make sure your Arrowhead winter transportation is ready to go. Things to check are the drive belt on you snowmobile OR side by side, spark plugs, tracks on both snowmobile OR side by side. Take care of it now or later but it is much easier now instead of breaking down and dealing with it under pressure.



I'd like to use this space to remind everyone about riding around or near heavy equipment or the snow groomer. Please be patient when near these pieces of equipment. The operators cannot see or hear you and are busy trying to maneuver the machine. Do not try to pass them while they are working as you endanger you and them, both. You may think they see you but unless they acknowledge your presence with a wave of their hand or by pulling over to let you pass, you need to assume they haven't seen you and maintain a safe distance from the equipment.

The snow groomer is a very unique piece of equipment and everyone needs to realize that. Unlike the motor grader or the loader, it can't get off the road to let you by. If you are approaching the groomer head on, please either turn around and take a different route or find a place to pull off the road until it passes. If you approach the groomer from the rear, either take a different route or proceed slowly behind the groomer until it can let you pass, generally at a road intersection. Under no circumstance should you try to pass the groomer by going off the roads to go around it. This can cause you to possibly hit something on the side of the road or you could be pulled into the groomer's tracks or under the groomer attachment which could cause extreme personal harm or possibly death. The best approach is to stay away and don't take the risk.

All for now and remember.....Do the snow dance. It's good exercise and it may actually bring snow.






Design Review Committee has been quite busy this winter streamlining processes, reviewing forms and finishing and/or continuing the activities from the 2017 building season. With the lack of snow, some construction projects have been extended thru the end of the year.

We haven't received any plans for 2018, yet; but our team is planning for a very busy 2018 building season. There has been many verbal inquiries for a wide variety of property owner-planned projects for 2018. The first formal DRC meeting is scheduled for March 12th, 2018.

A few reminders to help make your projects proceed smoothly:

- Your plans can be submitted at any time, but we need them at a minimum one week prior to the scheduled DRC meeting for review.
- If your project requires a Gunnison County Permit, an AIA Permit will need to be approved and issued, by the DRC, before the county will issue any permits. This document will be in addition to any other forms required by the county.



If a center pin cannot be located or verified, a survey will be required at the owner's expense before construction may begin.

Maintain the harmonious design of the community, protect and promote the value of properties in keeping with the Covenants and Design Regulations.

Job Description & Requirements:

- ✓ No architectural or construction experience is necessary, but helpful and certainly appreciated.
- ✓ The volunteers may be full time or part-time summer; but must be an Arrowhead member of the Association/Owner.
- ✓ The Volunteers must like to have fun and be outgoing, energetic, creative, open minded, able to work as a team and like helping people.
- ✓ An example of assigned tasks include: Locating property center pins and establish lot boundaries; Plotting new driveways and property access; Reviewing and approving requests for RV Pads, Sheds, new Home Construction, Garages, additions, and other permits, etc...

While the bark beetle problem continues to get worse every year around Arrowhead, the community continues to do a great job of fighting them off within Arrowhead. Many new owners and those that have not ordered MCH packs in the past are doing so this year. I think we are headed for a new record number of MCH packs being put up this spring. Thank you to all of you that have ordered. While the official ordering date has past you can still get an order in by contacting me at 541-729-6259 or by email at arrowheadforestmanger@gmail.com. Remember, if you have Douglas fir or spruce trees on your property there is a high risk of bark beetles killing those trees.



Forest

The spruce bud worm also continues to be a problem that affects all of our conifers: Douglas fir, spruce and subalpine fir (balsam). While they are unlikely to kill most trees, spruce bud worm can deform and weaken trees. There are two primary ways to deal with this problem. Spray the trees with liquid Sevin, which comes in a bottle that is attached to a garden hose. The amount of water pressure limits how high you can spray on taller trees. The second method is the use of ACE caps. This is small bullet shaped capsule that is inserted into a hole drilled in the tree. The capsule are inserted every 6" around the circumference of the tree. The chemical in the capsules is circulated through the tree killing the spruce bud worm. The ACE caps should be effective for two years.

The liquid Sevin is available at hardware stores and garden centers. The ACE caps cost about \$1.50 each in stores, but are available on line through Amazon for \$1.00 each in a package of 75.

For answers on other tree questions please review the forestry articles in the February and April 2017 Smoke Signals that can be found on the AIA web page by going to the lower left of the opening screen.

The Arrowhead Forest Refuse Site is a key element in maintaining forest health and preventing human caused fires. The lease on the current site is not being renewed and the AIA board is in the process of finding a new location. More information will be provided as that process continues.






